- Week 1: Students must bring 6 un-iced cupcakes, 16oz of decorator icing and icing bags.
- Week 2: Students must bring one 8" cake, filling for cake, two 10" cake circles, and 5 cups of icing.
- Week 3: Students must bring 8 treats (brownies, cookies, ding dongs or any flat treat to decorate) and 5 cups of icing.
- Week 4: Students must bring one 8" cake (torted and filled) and 7 ½ cups of icing
