



CITIZENSHIP PREPARATION

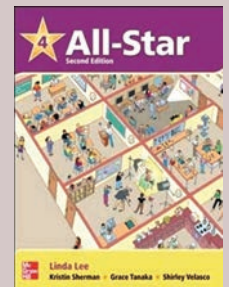

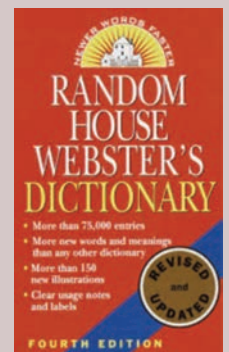
