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Rowland Adult and Community Education is fully accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC). Students will be granted a high school diploma upon successful completion of all requirements. Credit may be awarded for previous schooling, work experience or military service. Students work at their own pace on individual contracts with instructor support. A minimum of 10 credits must be taken at Rowland Adult prior to issuing a diploma. ### High School Diploma:

Upon successful completion of the Rowland Unified School District high school graduation requirements for adults, which is 205 credits, a student will be issued a High School Diploma from Rowland Adult and Community Education and the Rowland Unified School District. The High School Diploma Requirements are shown below. Any verified high school credit earned is counted toward the high school diploma requirement.

### High School Equivalency:

To obtain an official California High School Equivalency Certificate, test takers must meet all the following State requirements:

- You have not completed high school.
- You are a California resident or a member of the armed services assigned to duty in the state of California.
- You have passed all portions of a High School Equivalency (HSE) Test that has been approved by the State Board of Education taken at a testing center that has been approved by California Department of Education.

Test takers must also meet one of the following requirements:

- You are 18 years of age or within 60 days of your 18th birthday.
- You are within 60 days of when you would have graduated from high school had you remained in school and completed the usual courses required for graduation.
- You are 17 years of age, have been out of school for at least 60 consecutive days and provide a letter of request from the military, a post-secondary educational institution, or employer that states the need for you to take a HSE Test.



A student will be issued a **GED** upon successful completion of all four of the **GED** exams, which are:

- Reasoning Through Language Arts
- Mathematical Reasoning
- Science
- Social Science

**HiSET** consist of five tests (paper format):

- Language Arts - Reading (65 minutes)
- Language Arts - Writing (120 minutes)
- Mathematics (90 minutes)
- Social Studies (80 minutes)
- Science (70 minutes)

The pass score on each of the **GED** exams must be 145 points or higher. The cost per test is \$35.00. Total for all four tests is \$140.00. To prepare you to pass the **GED**, RACE recommends the following:

- 1) Enroll and COMPLETE the 12 hour **GED** Prep Course
- 2) Attain a **GED** Practice Score of 150 points or higher per practice test

RACE has been administering the **GED** since 1980 and the students who have adhered to completing the Prep Course and passing the Practice Test at the score indicated typically pass the **GED** on their first attempt.

To take the **GED** Test you must have one of the following:

- 1) A VALID California Drivers License or;
- 2) A VALID California Identification Card or;
- 3) A Government Issued ID Card

- Test Fee: \$100 (which includes all 5 subtests and 2 free retakes). Test Fee is non-refundable and testing must be completed within 12 months of registration.
- Must meet with counselor at least 3 school days prior to testing.
